Holy Communion

We celebrate the Lord's Supper as part of our worship service, on the 1st& 3rd Sunday of the month during the 8:30am service and the 2nd& 4th Sunday during the 10:30am service. We invite those who share our confession of faith, namely, that Jesus is truly present in, with & under the bread and wine for the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation to commune with us. Those who share a different confession or have not yet been instructed in the Lord's Supper are welcome to come forward and receive a blessing. We offer individual cups. The light-colored cups in the center are grape juice instead of wine. Pastor will be available prior to the worship service to answer any questions about Holy Communion.

On this most holy night, we gather in silent awe, preparing to worship the Christ child. As we consider the birth of our Savior, we recognize our great need for Him. We confess before God and to one another that we are by nature sinful and unclean. We examine our lives according to the perfect Law of God and recognize our many sins against God and one another. In humble adoration, we bow before Jesus, the sinless Lamb of God, who was sent to be our substitute, our sacrifice, and the atonement for the sins of the whole world.

(a time of silence for personal reflection and confession of sins)

- P Dearest Jesus,
- for us sinners, You became a child. Since we could not fulfill the Father's just and holy will, You fulfilled it for us. We bow before You humbly confessing our sinfulness that separates us from You. We repent of our sins in thought, word, and action that oppose and neglect Your righteous ways. Forgive us our sins that we may be reconciled to You, through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.
- On this night, I announce to you good news of great joy, for unto you is born this night in the city of David, a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. He brought with Him forgiveness and salvation for all who believe and trust in Him. For His sake God forgives you of your sins. Therefore, like the shepherds, go forth in true joy and excitement for your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.


Epistle

Christmas Gospel

Luke 2:1-14

Lexi: Tonight's Gospel reading is from Luke chapter 2:

¹In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. ²This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. ³And all went to be registered, each to his own town. ⁴And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, ⁵to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. ⁶And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. ⁷And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

⁸And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. ⁹And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with fear. ¹⁰And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of a

great joy that will be for all the people. ¹¹For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. ¹²And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." ¹³And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying,

¹⁴"Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!"



Luke 2:15-20

Ava: Our Christmas Gospel continues as the angels depart from the shepherds and they go into Bethlehem:

¹⁵When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us." ¹⁶And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger. ¹⁷And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this child. ¹⁸And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them. ¹⁹But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart. ²⁰And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

Luther's Evening Prayer


Ava: Let us pray together:

The Pastor lights a single candle from the altar and lights the candles of the ushers. They in turn light the candle of the first person in each pew at the center aisle. The flame is passed along to each person in the pew. Please keep the lighted candle upright to avoid dripping wax on the floor and yourself. Parents should determine if it is appropriate for their child to hold a lighted candle.


Lord's Prayer 162
