From our Pastor:

What is Baptism? In the Small Catechism, Luther wrote, "Baptism is not just plain water, but it is the water included in God's command and combined with God's word."

As Luther further explained, "It works forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare." Literally, Baptism is one of God's means of grace. This means that through Baptism something great, almost miraculous happens! Paul says it best in Romans 6, "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized have been buried with Christ in His death, so that just as He was raised...we too may walk in newness of life."

Baptism is an amazing gift from God, and today as we look at the text, the people are receiving goodness and grace as they enter the Jordan River. In this situation it is symbolic of forgiveness as the people come forward and repent. Yet, even John says someone will come after me that will baptize you with fire and the Spirit. Even John recognizes there is a greater baptism that works far more than just forgiveness.

Baptism into the Holy Spirit is a new life. The Bible often talks about a new life through the Spirit, and the Baptism John referenced is the same that Luther referenced many years later. John's was just symbolic of washing the filth. Luther emphasized eternal life, because the Baptism by fire and the Spirit leads to eternal life.

This is God's grace in action! Working in us far greater than what we realize to make us His own. Remember in baptism you not only were washed but brought into the name of God. It is a God's grace thing! What an amazing God!!!!
